HOW TO REGISTER

To apply for classes, register online at www.mckinneycenter.com. All registrations will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis.

ENROLLMENT

Class space is limited. Registration is first-come, first-serve. Please register early. Early Bird Registration Discount ends August 15, 2020. The deadline for registration is August 21, 2020.

TUITION

Tuition amounts are noted in the Class Catalog. Please note that there will be a small processing fee added to the end of your registration to cover the cost of our on-line system. There is no sales tax.

DISCOUNTS

\$10 Early Bird discount if you register before August 15, 2020.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships are available. Scholarships recipients can receive up to one free class per semester. Additional classes are regular price. Students over the age of 12 and one parent must complete 10 hours each of volunteer work during the semester in exchange for the scholarship. SUPPLIES

Class supplies are included in the tuition fee unless otherwise noted in the class description.

CANCELATIONS

Jonesborough's Mary B. Martin Program for the Arts reserves the right to cancel, combine or reschedule classes as needed. Classes not meeting the minimum enrollment will be canceled one week in advance of the start date. Students will be notified by email if a class has been canceled and will receive a full refund. If classes are canceled due to federal, state, or local mandates all efforts will be made to transition classes online. Refunds will not be given for classes that transition to online meetings.

REFUNDS

Refunds must be requested prior to the semester deadline for registration. A \$25 processing fee will be deducted from the refund. There are no refunds after the semester deadline for registration. There are no refunds for classes that transition to online meetings.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

In case of inclement weather, The Mary B. Martin Program for the Arts follows the Washington County Public School System closure procedure. Faculty will work with students and/or guardians to schedule make-up classes for weather closings or any other reason.

SCHOOL BREAKS & HOLIDAYS

Due to having students across several school districts we will have class during fall and springs breaks and holidays unless otherwise informed by your instructor or McKinney Center Staff.

CLASS CHECK-IN PROCEDURE

For students under 18 – Drop-off and pick-up will happen at the back of the building. On the first day of class you will receive a parking pass with your child's last name. Please have this in your dashboard in the left-hand side of your vehicle. This will help us with identifying you as the authorized person to pick-up your child. Students will not be allowed to be picked up by individuals without this parking pass. If you need an extra pass to give to a spouse, grandparent, etc., please notify us and we will make an extra.

Guardians may leave or wait for their student in the parking lot or designated waiting area inside. Guardians are not allowed in class areas unless approved by the Director. If you have a special need please discuss this with the Director prior to the first day of class.

For adult students – please park your vehicle and come into class using the Office door. Your instructor will take role at the beginning of class.

INFECTIOUS DISEASE and COVID-19 PROCEDURES

By registering for classes and agreeing to the Terms and Conditions of registering you have promised the following:

- The temperature of the student is checked and below 100.4 prior to every class, the student has not taken temperature reducing
 medicine in the past 24 hours, or has not had diarrhea in the past 24 hours.
- That as the student enters the classroom they will wash their hands prior to taking their seat.
- That the student has not been around anyone who is currently diagnosed or under quarantine for COVID-19.
- That the student has been made aware of social distancing and hand-washing procedures.

The McKinney Center has adopted the following procedures to assist in lessening the spread of infectious disease:

- Limited class sizes to half capacity of specific classrooms, sometimes less depending on the class.
- Seating will be distanced as far apart as possible.
- Scheduled classes in each room 30 minutes apart for appropriate cleaning for furniture and supplies.
- Has hand-washing stations and hand-sanitizer in each classroom.
- Can provide disposable masks or gloves for students upon request. Please dispose of your disposable mask and gloves appropriately
 and do not reuse.
- Has trained faculty and staff how to properly wear and dispose of masks and gloves.
- Changed check-in and out procedures to reduce shared use of pens and to limit the number of individuals inside the building.
- Will have doors open when the outside temperature is appropriate to limit touching of doors and to increase air flow.
- Reduced the number of individuals who can use restrooms at one time.
- Will continue a strict a regiment of thoroughly disinfecting and cleaning the entire building each day and throughout the day as needed.
- Will have new barriers around staff desk areas.
- Signage encouraging visitors to practice safe hygiene and social distancing.

While at the McKinney Center students should be prepared to do the following:

- First, do not attend class if you feel sick. You may be able to view the class from home if MKC staff is available and given enough lead time to set up the needed technology.
- Wash hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If water is not available, use hand sanitizer.
- Avoid touching eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze or the inside of your elbow when you cough or sneeze.
- Immediately discard tissues in a trash can.
- Avoid using other's tools, work spaces, etc.
- Practice social distancing.

If you get sick while at the McKinney Center

- Notify your instructor or staff person immediately.
- If the student can drive, they should be allowed to leave the building immediately and seek medical attention.
- If the student cannot drive, they will be placed in an isolated area until their ride can pick them up. Children will be attended by a MKC staff person or volunteer until the parent arrives.
- The student's work area will be immediately disinfected and cleaned.

ART FOR CHILDREN

Art Adventures

\$132 with Donna Bird Aug 27, 2020 at 4:30 pm, runs for 10 weeks Grades K- 2

Creative Constructions

Creative Constructions is designed for students who have taken Art Adventures or have the basic art skills needed to create more complex activities and projects. This class will allow young creatives to construct original pieces of art and to learn more about painting, drawing, mixed media, narrative art, and sculpture. This Fall, Creative Constructions student will be introduced to a variety of art materials and learn new artistic techniques while reinforcing the basic elements of art. For example, students will work with scratchboard, learn perspective drawing, try their hand at watercolor and acrylic painting, and learn about master artists. Small class size allows for individual attention in a fun and inviting environment!

HOMESCHOOL ART FOR CHILDREN

Homeschool - Art Adventures

\$132 with Donna Bird Aug 27, 2020 at 9:30 am, runs for 10 weeks Grades K-2

This class introduces your child to learn basic art skills and gives them an opportunity to grow as a young artist. Art Adventures has been designed for 5 to 7-year-old children to strengthen their knowledge in art and further develop art vocabulary and skills. With activities such as painting, drawing, and sculpture, students explore their creativity with exciting and fun projects in the fall. Homeschool Art - Creative Constructions

This class is for students who have taken Art Adventures or have some experience with art lessons and have the ability to attempt more complex skills including perspective, sculpture, and painting techniques. Classes are designed to reinforce basic elements of art, while introducing a variety of mediums and artistic techniques to create original pieces of art. For example, students will work with scratchboard, learn to draw in 3D, try their hand at watercolor and acrylic painting, and learn about master artists. The curriculum is ongoing and projects change every semester. Small class size allows for individual attention.

Pottery Basics Daytime Class

Masks will be required due to close contact during demonstrations and one-on-one instruction.

WORKSHOPS FOR CHILDREN

Mandala Magic Workshop for Kids

Come have fun with the magic of mandalas! Mandalas are circle drawings that are full of possibilities. Students will learn all about mandalas and their radial & symmetrical designs. Students will create different kinds using a variety of materials of their choosing- from stickers to beads to mixed media to sharpies & markers.



Crochet Bowls Workshop

CERAMICS FOR CHILDREN

Clay Buddies

with Kara Bledsoe Oct 17, 2020 at 9 am, runs for 4 weeks Grades K- 2

This entry level clay class is for the youngest of elementary school age children. Each class will be project based to introduce young children to different clay working techniques. Children will learn planning and decorating techniques to complete projects. Masks will be required due to close contact during demonstrations and one-on-one instruction.

Kids N Clay

Young Potters

DANCE FOR CHILDREN & TEENS

Ballet for Kids - Level 1

This class will introduce the classical dance of Ballet which focuses on one's physical alignment and lines of the body to show a dancer as powerful as well as graceful. Ballet level 1 is perfect for beginner dancers to learn the classical techniques.

Beginning Acoustic Guitar- Group Class- Kids and Teens \$100

Hand-Building with Clay \$150 with Jess Parks Aug 25, 2020 at 6 pm, runs for 6 weeks Grade 9- Adult

If you are interested in clay, but aren't sure the wheel is for you, consider hand-building and begin creating wonderful functional pieces of artwork on your very first day. This class will give you the opportunity to create unique projects each week. Students will focus on the vocabulary of clay, slab construction, pinch pots, surface texture, clay impression and more. For students who are looking for a place to express their creativity, hand-building may be the experience for you.

The Potter's Wheel Series

Level 1 \$150 with Jess Parks Aug 26, 2020 at 6 pm, runs for 6 weeks Adults

This beginning level class is designed for those wishing to develop their own skills on the potter's wheel. This class is designed to build students' skills in the foundational elements of clay, glazes, and terminology. Every class will demonstrate a different wheel throwing exercise.

Grade 6- Adult


Our new Mixed Media class builds upon a foundation of drawing, while expanding the possibilities with a multitude of mediums. Students will learn how to create varying degrees of line width using pen & ink; while also being introduced to brush pens -- creating smooth, flowing energetic lines. A world of color, texture and composition will be explored, using techniques from printmaking, painting and even textiles! Students are encouraged to explore processes such as collage and abstraction. All skill levels and ages are welcome!

Portrait Drawing - ONLINE

\$100 plus supplies with Allison Parker Sept 12, 2020 at 3pm, runs for 6 weeks Grade 9 - Adult

In this dynmaic online portrait class, students will learn how to complete a portrait commission from start-to-finish. We will begin with proportion studies and measurements of the head, and then learn how to simplify features into light and shadow shapes to create an accurate likeness. Students will first learn how to analyze and study portait strategies from a master work of art, followed by live zoom sessions drawing from a live model. Each student will work independently outside of class to complete a "commission: from a photograph, learning the process of completing a professional portrait from start to finish. This will include pricing, contracts, meeting deadlines, and how to involve a client in your process. All levels are welcome, and this class is a fun introduction for beginners as well as a way for more advanced artists to polish their skills! Demonstrations will be drawingbased, however students may choose to draw or paint depending on skill level.



PAINTING FOR TEENS AND ADULTS

Basics of Oil Painting

\$158, plus some supplies with Sharon Squibb Sep 14, 2020 at 5:30 pm, runs for 10 weeks Grade 9- Adult

Emphasis is placed on basic painting techniques, color mixing and composition, and depiction of light and shadow. Students will do step-by-step paintings on canvas suitable for beginners as well as students with more experience. Water-mixable oils will be used for those who are sensitive to solvents. Some supplies will be provided, including a mixing tray with lid, canvas pads, and linen panels. Students will be responsible for purchasing other supplies (approximately \$20 value). You will be provided with a supply list. McKinney Center Staff can assist in ordering supplies if necessary.

This class will transition to online if the need arises.

Basics of Watercolor - ONLINE CLASS

\$115 plus supplies with Sharon Squibb Aug 25, 2020 at 5 pm, runs for 10 weeks Grade 9 - Adult

This is a class for students who would like to explore the basics of watercolor painting from home. Zoom instruction includes step-by-step projects designed to guide you through the painting process from start to finish. The course will include an overview of special brushes, materials, and techniques artists use to create watercolor art. Students will work on each project along with the instructor as she demonstrates the steps. You will also receive emails of detailed PowerPoint presentations that illustrate each project so that you may practice further or complete a piece at home. No experience necessary. Students will receive a supply list by email after they register. Students may purchase their own supplies or through the McKinney Center for an extra \$50.00. If purchased through the McKinney Center, materials can be picked up prior to the first class (if given proper notice).



MOSAICS FOR TEENS AND ADULTS

Mosaic Pet Portrait

\$162 with Beverly Thomas Jenkins Aug 29, 2020 at 11:30 am, runs for 5 weeks Grade 9- Adult

Introduction to the Zentangle Method of Drawing

Pottery Wheel - Bowls - 2 Day Workshop

Hydroponics - DIY Horizontal Hydroponic System

Hydroponics is a form of gardening that uses no soil, but instead grows plans in a solution of water and nutrients. A hydroponic system can grow plants and vegetables faster and year-round. Plants grown this way usually yield more, require less space, and conserve soil and water. Students will be taught how to make two different systems in an inexpensive way. Students will also learn the benefits of various nutrients, and the history of hydroponics. The amazing thing about this system is that students can continue to expand their garden at home!

Soap Making for Beginners

Mary B. Martin Legacy

Jonesborough's Mary B. Martin Program for the Arts offers unique art opportunities for adults, children, and teens. Created through a generous donation by James C. Martin on behalf of his wife, the Mary B. Martin, the program is designed to inspire area residents through appreciation for and participation in the various forms of art and expression. The Mary B. Martin Program for the Arts is housed at the McKinney Center at Booker T. Washington School. The comprehensive program also includes other venues such as the Jonesborough Repertory Theatre, Jonesborough Elementary School, and the International Storytelling Center.



McKinney Legacy

A strong advocate for education, Ernest McKinney was deeply community minded. In 1968, on the same day Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. was assassinated, Ernest McKinney was elected as the first African-American Alderman in Jonesborough. As an Alderman, from 1978 - 1984, Ernest McKinney worked diligently to improve the quality of life for all citizens. He was a leader in the creation of several town initiatives: the Senior Center, Recreation Program, Tourism Program, and Jonesborough's Head Start Program, just to name a few. He understood the importance of creating a strong downtown presence and believed in building a community accessible to everyone. In 2009, Ernest McKinney passed away at age 86, leaving a legacy of education and service.
